





- We want to hear from you and discuss how we can improve Exchange Network services. We hope to build community among partners and serve as a node for routing your questions as well.





Thinking About the Future of Data Sharing.


Should "data sharing" be broader to encompass the full <u>data lifecycle</u>: "collecting, sharing and using data."

Meeting Reflections


- Reinvigoration starts with broader engagement.

- Meaningful engagement with tribes is critical to success.
- Up-Front conversations around the strategic direction of the Exchange Network.



Workgroup Outcomes


- Finalize the E-Enterprise Digital Strategy.
 Workgroup iterated on the EE Digital Strategy and recommended operationalizing the Strategy's principles.
- Host Tribal Engagement Roundtable at Penobscot.
 Roundtable will focus on how EPA can more
 meaningfully engage with Tribes through the Exchange
 Network.
- Examine EN Data Flows.

 Identified need to chart existing EN data flows to understand where we should go in the future.




Digital Strategy

- Released as Interim Digital Strategy in 2019. Shared Vision among E-Enterprise partners to better coordinate their information technology (IT) systems and services.
- Leading with Three Core Principles:
 Customer-centric, Information-centric & Shared Platforms
- Guides Modernization Efforts to meet business needs, maximize resources, and enhance interoperability among States, Tribes and EPA:
 - Drinking Water State-Federal-Tribal Information Exchange System (DW-SFTIES)
 - Combined Air Emissions Reporting System (CAERS)
 - Integrated Compliance Information System (ICIS)



Digital Strategy: Next Steps

- Workgroup agrees that Strategy principles and strategic actions are relevant today.
- Recommend forming agile teams to:
 - Ensure the Strategy is relevant to States & Tribes
 - Update the Strategy to include value proposition, mission context, remove dated information & recommend improvements
 - Identify activities partners can implement to further operationalize the Strategy's principles



Tribal Engagement

- **Welcome Frank Harjo**, who serves as co-chair of the Tribal Exchange Group and GIS Manager with the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.
- Proposing a Tribal Engagement Roundtable.
 Idea introduced during Collaborative Exchange. Build shared understanding of Tribal Experiences in EN through time. Identify actionable steps EN can take to engage tribes in a more structured way.
- In-person event with virtual components.

 Meeting dates are set for November 28th through 30th at the Penobscot Nation, Maine.




Roundtable Goals

- **1. Understand** how Tribes are currently engaged by the Exchange Network;
- 2. **Document** what is working well for Tribes as well as challenges encountered;
- **3. Clarify** the role of the Tribal Exchange Group (TXG) in the Exchange Network and its relationship to other Exchange Network-affiliated programs; and,
- **4. Identify** strategies and solutions to improve Tribal engagement, including potential State and Tribal synergies.




Data Flows

- Welcome Eric Cleckler, who serves as an IT Manager with Alabama's Department of Environmental Management.
- **EN has 20 Years of Success.** As a platform, the EN has been remarkably durable, stable; but technology, business needs, and expectations change.
- Analyze Active Exchange Network Data Flows to understand the current state to know where we can go in the future.
 - How do partner agencies and programs use existing EN data flows?
 - How, why have usage patterns have change?
 - How do current flows meet, not meet user needs?




Next Steps

- Organize Sprint Teams with Exchange Network.
 The first sprint will conduct a quick scan of current usage patterns; the second sprint will take a deeper dive on flow usage, user satisfaction, and future requirements.
- Close coordination with State and Tribal Partners.
 Commitment to ensure that data flows and future systems meet partners where they are.

- **Efforts are underway** to reinvigorate the Exchange Network and EPA, State & Tribal Partnerships.
- Coordinated meetings began in June 2023 and will continue with Agile workgroups that will advance EN action items.


